3. The Principle of Responsibility

The importance of a good conscience was emphasized by Paul when he sent Timothy to battle for the right, armed only with his "faith and a good conscience." He explained that some have laid these weapons aside, and have "made shipwreck of their faith." (See I Timothy 1:19.) A good conscience is the ability to look every person in the eye and know that not one of them can point a finger and say, "You offended me and never tried to make it right." Each of us is to "... have always a conscience void of offence toward God, and toward men" (Acts 24:16).



E. BEWARE OF MISPLACED CONVICTION.



The importance of clearing our consciences quickly is emphasized by Jesus in Matthew 5:23–24: "Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar . . . go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift." We should clear our consciences with the Lord first, then with those we have offended, beginning with those we have hurt the most. It is wise to be accountable to a friend. Make sure a full confession is made, because partial confession is more damaging than none.
